

How do we meet the 16-19 years study programme requirements?

During pupils' time in Post 16 they are provided with a structured and challenging personalised learning programme that supports their development and progression in line with their plans for adulthood and career aspirations where appropriate. Typically, pupils would follow two distinct pathways which are outlined below.
